



Tips for Public Speaking

HELPFUL HINTS:

Select a topic that is interesting to you.

Gather information from different sources.

Organize your information.

Make eye contact with your audience while giving your speech.

Stand with a good posture.

Speak loudly and clearly.

You may use note cards if your speech is not memorized.

NO props or visual aids are allowed for speeches.

Step 1 — Planning

Your speech should be 2-3 minutes long.

- 1. Decide on a Topic
 - Select something that you like.
 - · Select something that you can find information about.
 - · Select something that 4-H can be included in.
- 2. Decide on a Purpose -Your speech should entertain, inform, stimulate, or persuade.
- 3. Brainstorm Ideas for your Topic
 - · Write out ideas on notebook paper.
 - Research info from 4-H office, libraries, internet, interviews, etc.

Step 2 — Organization

Step 3 — Practice, Practice!

There are several good ways to practice your speech. The more you practice, the better your speech will be!

- Practice in front of a mirror.
- Practice in front of friends and family.
- Record yourself speaking and listen to/watch the recording.

Step 4 — Giving Your Speech

Now you are ready for the speech contest! Here are a few pointers to make your speech a success:

- Relax Take a deep breath before you speak, and have fun with your speech!
- Appearance Stand up straight and tall, and don't lean on the podium.
- Notes Use your notes, but don't read them or hold them in front of your face.
- Eye Contact Be sure to look up at your audience as you give your speech.
- Voice Speak in a loud, clear voice that your audience can understand.

4-H Poster Contest

4-H Poster Contest - Two Options, One Contest

PHYSICAL POSTER or DIGITAL POSTER focusing on one of the 4-H projects from the 4-H Project Selection Guide

Contest Rules

- 1. Only one poster entry will be accepted per 4-H member.
- 2. Physical Posters must be 14 x 22 inches. This is a one-half sheet of poster board.
- 3. Digital Posters must be in a PDF format sent to samialbright@utk.edu.
- 4. Design your poster horizontally.
- 5.NO GLITTER.
- 6. The theme should relate to 4-H, promoting 4-H or encouraging someone to join 4-H.
- 7. You must promote 4-H and include the 4-H emblem.
- 8. No 3-D objects that extend more than 1/8 inch.
- 9. Nothing should be placed on or blocking the 4-H emblem (clover).
- 10. The stem of the leaf of the clover should always turn to the right
- 11. The 4-H emblem should not be placed under words or graphics
- 12. Use the whole 4-H emblem, do not distort or warp the dimensions.
- 13. No copyrighted cartoon characters, such as Mickey Mouse, SpongeBob, etc.
- 14. <u>Back of the Poster</u> put your first and last name, school, grade, teacher's name, home address, and parent email. <u>If you do not have this information on the back of your poster, IT WILL NOT JUDGED.</u>

What you need to do

Pick a 4-H related topic — see 4-H Project Selection Guide for some ideas.

Decide who the poster is for — is it for kids, teachers, parents, 4-H members, non-members?

Draw a picture that will get people interested. Use bright colors!

Write a headline for the poster — nice and big so it gets attention.

Put in your message — what you want people to do or remember about your topic.

Now put your name and information on the BACK — it's your poster!

4-H Photography Contest

Get out that camera and take your best shot! It's time to enter the Photography Contest!

Rules

- The 4-H members must take all photos.
- Photos may not be over one year old.
- Color or Black and White photos may be entered.
- Photos should be mounted on paper or poster board with a caption or title under the photo.
- Each entry should be no larger than 8x10 inches including photo backing.
- Each photo should be mounted separately.
- · No frames will be accepted.
- On the back of the mounting, write:
 - 4-H Member Name
 - Category for your picture
 - Address
 - School
 - Grade
 - Phone number
 - Guardian Email
- Each member may enter up to two categories with one picture per category (the same photo can not be used for two categories).

Categories: 4-H Project Area (include the project area on the back of the photo) People (group or individual) Landscapes, Floral, Animals or Birds, and Miscellaneous

Winning photos from each club will be collected at your March meeting and taken for the county-wide judging.

1st and 2nd place winners will be named in each category in early April.

The "Best of Show" photo will be one photo selected over all entries at the county contest.
