

### Service Learning Chairman Responsibilities

A service learning project is an activity that involves the entire club participating in meeting the needs of the community or school.

#### **Before the meeting:**

- Discuss and decide on a service learning activity to help or encourage others in your community.
- Promote the project and lead the club to complete it.
  - Ensure you give yourself and your club time to complete the project before your monthly meeting!
- Complete the reporting page for the project before your club's meeting that month.
  - Example: At the March meeting, you will report on the project completed between your February and March meeting.
  - Things to include in the report: # of youth and adults who brought in items, success stories, challenges you faced, etc.

### **During the meeting:**

- Report on the project that was completed the prior month. Include the steps you took to accomplish this project and the results of the project.
- The Service Learning Chairman, along with the Teacher, should lead the club in introducing the project for the next month and make sure it is completed.

### After the meeting:

- Report completed projects in the Service Learning Report Book.

The Service Learning chairman is responsible for delivering items collected, made, etc. to the organization that the club chooses to help.
